Several dreams, actually.



They need a director to imagine the space of the play and they need a dramaturge to serve as both editor and guide. The process of creation is long and often messy. It takes a dedicated team to make this happen. The final element is the audience.

Tonight, we invite you to come and work with us in this essential step in the process of theatre creation.

Thank you for being here tonight to help nurture these exciting new and local voices. You're helping us all realize our dreams.
